The Council donated \$500 and organized a collection of needed furnishings.



LITTLE BUGS. BIG BITE. Chiggers are tiny members of the arachnid family. They are also known as berry bugs, harvest mites, or red bugs. They live in forests and grasslands, in low damp areas, along lakes and streams, and even in drier places such as lawns, golf courses, and parks. Most active on summer and fall afternoons when

temperatures are warm and inviting, they can quickly attach to your skin if you walk by and brush up against vegetation where they live. They attach to various animals, including humans, and feed on skin often causing itching. Chiggers do not actually bite, but form a hole in the skin and can cause severe irritation and swelling. Itching from a chigger bite may not occur until 24 to 48 hours later. The intensely itchy welts can be alleviated through use of over-the-counter corticosteroid creams and antihistamines such as Benadryl. Cool showers will also help reduce itching. Sulfur (powder) may help prevent bites when going outside in wet or damp grass and weeds. Chigger bites are uncomfortable, itchy, annoying, and can make it difficult to sleep. In most cases, chigger bites don't cause any harm to your health. Chiggers feed on skin cells but not on blood. They do not carry or transmit disease. However, chigger bites can become infected from too much scratching. Notify your doctor if you have swelling, fever, or other signs of infection. — *Submitted by Dianne Bliss, RN*
